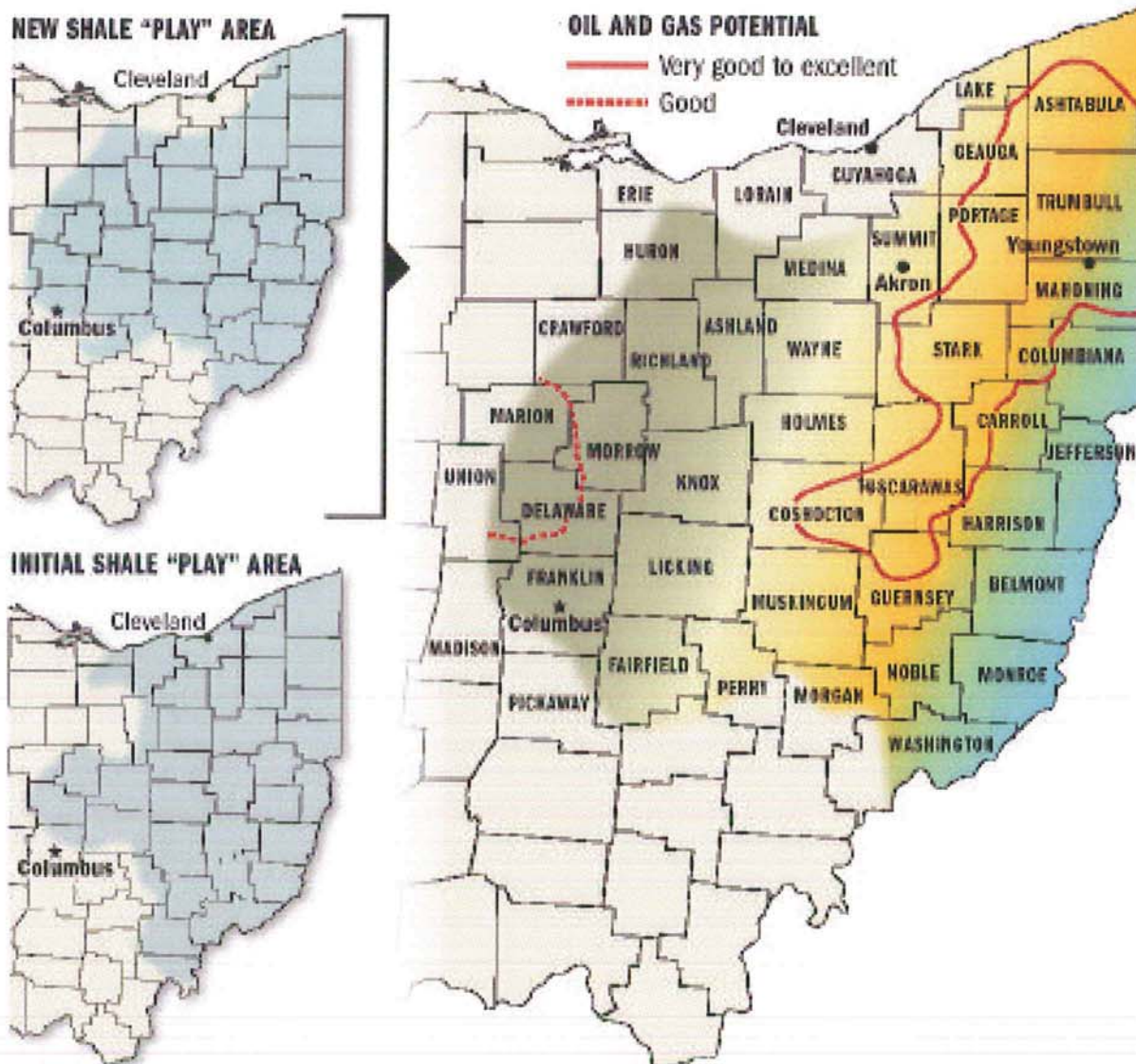
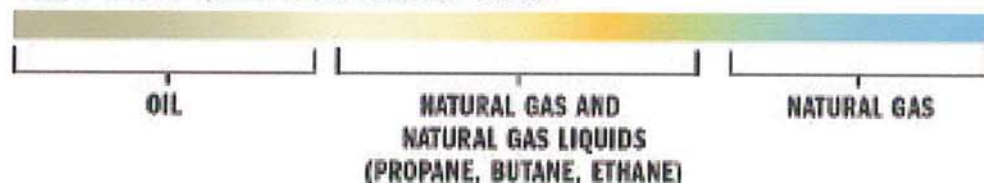


Changing Utica shale's "play"
